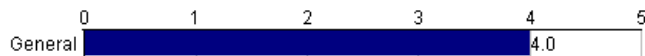

2	Throughout the several semesters I worked to earn my associates and bachelors degree I used programs in Microsoft to produce term papers, presentations in written and oral form , research papers, and power point presentations, and one science research poster. Sitting Bull College assisted me in attaining my educational goals because they require enough work with technology that I learned it proficiently. My critical thinking skills were strong when I entered college, as I wrote paper after paper I learned much more about what I did not know. My critical thinking skills and problem solving skills became much stronger and I am very confidant now.
3	Through the classes we take we learn these skills and can develop them more. 4	Through my internship. I was given the opportunity to work on various projects on my own. I didn't have anybody looking over my shoulder and I was able to complete the tasks on time and was given a lot of excellent feedback on a job well done.
5	This was taught in Transitions.
6	This is another outcome that I have learned through Renee's transitions class. I have learned to know my position and place where I work, how to be a great employee, and establish myself so that my chances will be high in receiving a promotion. I also gained great job interviewing skills which is highly important.

8	Students develop the work ethics and skills needed for a work environment through experience and the transitions class.

9	Sitting Bull College sends out emails when ever there is a job available in the standing rock area they want you to find work and they give you opportunities and help you find a job. They want you to achieve your goals and be independent and a hard worker by giving us the information and providing us the resources.
10	Sitting Bull College provides a unique and diverse environment in the workplace and in the classrooms.
11	Self teach, study groups and study time has help me independently work towards finishing my degree of choice.
12	No problem with me here, I worked with a group when that opportunity came up and had no problem working independently. I am naturally self-motivated and work toward my goals without being pushed. 3	This was revealed at SBC through the different NAS courses...
4	The small school atmosphere provided me with a more hands on approach in my schooling. I believe that helped me build on these skills.
5	The ochethi sakowin class gave me so much understanding of the Lakota/Dakota/Nakota culture that I've always wanted to know. This class to me seems like a must for everyone. It helped me understand the culture here and want to know more about my own culture more.
6	The native american language class was interesting and did help with understanding more of the culture.
7	Students gain an understanding and appreciation for Native American cultures from classes and from experience by living on the reservation.
8	Sitting Bull College offers many cultural classes: learning the language, traditional plants, history of our culture. It is a great way to get involved with learning our culture and our language. However, I have tried taking an indigenous women's class and ethnobotany, but the level of classes were advanced, therefore they stopped me from having those experiences. I think maybe it would be a good idea to have an assisted teacher in those classes who could help a student who is not as advanced as the others.

11	My NAS classes have given me great insight on the Native Culture through past experiences of our Ancestors .it gives me a sense of what kind of people we are and that we have always been strong as a native people always will be. This will help me strive harder for my educational goals.
12	Lakota language and culture courses as well as free crafts and art classes were offered at Sitting Bull College to provide me with understanding and appreciation for my culture.
13	In my Lakota/Dakota language class. The class was difficult at times but it made me appreciate our culture even more and opened up my eyes to the importance of the revitalization of our language.
14	I've only taken one course pertaining to the Native American culture and that course was Lakota Language.
15	I took a class called Oceti Sakonwin Kinships and Social Systems during the NoDAPL movement. This has really helped me to understand my culture better and to also understand different cultures that came to stand with Standing Rock during this time.
16	I love where I come from, I am Lakota by blood and love every day of it
17	I learned how to speak a variety of Lakota words, and can share that language with the students I work with.
18	I have learned a lot through my Lakota class I took with Gladis. She was WONDERFUL!!!! She not only helped us learn some of the language she talked about her experience and really went into things! My ethnobotany teacher, Linda also demonstrates skills in the class that really help understand and appreciate the culture more. Roxy has also done this in the core classes too, and over all I am impressed with my teachers and how they can show us and teach us about the culture. (all my teachers have talked about the culture but the first 2 really stand out to me)
19	I have had to do projects that are about the Native American culture.
20	I am Native American and I like to learn about my culture.
21	At Sitting Bull College, the students and faculty come from all walks of life. Most of the conversations and discussions that take place in the classroom will have a "Native" undertone or viewpoint because we are on the reservation and it is always the elephant in the room. But as students progress through the college curriculum and they are exposed to the Lakota language, culture, and people; one can't help but appreciate the richness and beauty our history, struggle, and perseverance in an age of technological advances and dependence on social media.
